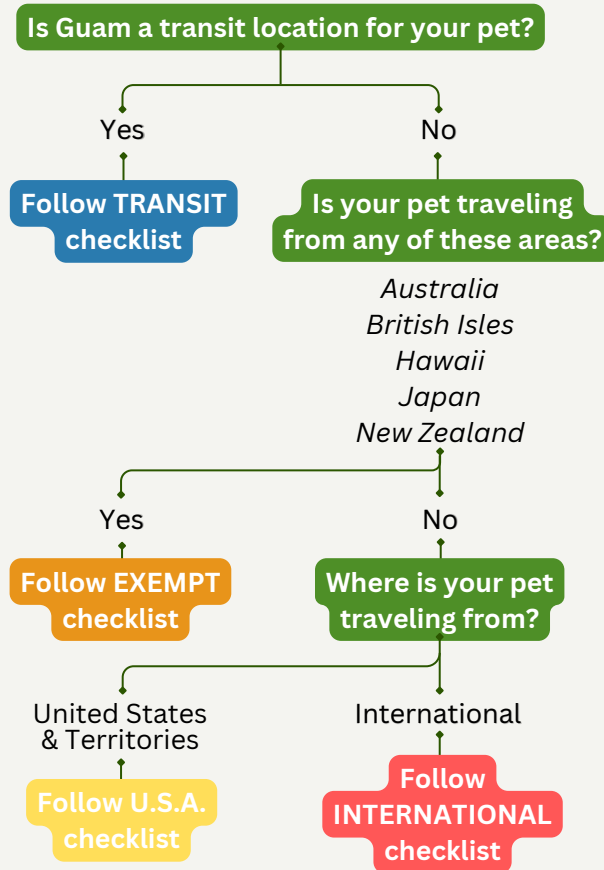


All pets entering Guam must undergo clearance upon arrival, even if they are simply being transferred.

Before gathering documents, the first step is identifying where your pet is traveling from. Import requirements vary depending on the country or region of origin.

Important to Note When Gathering Documents

Application for Entry: you may find the 'Application for Animal Entry Permit' here by scanning the QR Code or on our website under 'Resources'.

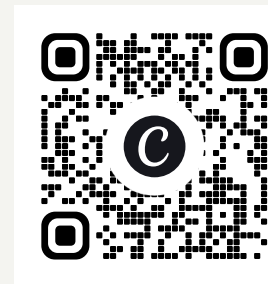
Payment:

- Methods: Exact cash, local check, cashier's check, or money order.
- Delivery: In-person or by mail to our office address.
- Third-Party Payers: A rep may pay on behalf of applicant; no form needed, only applicant name.
- Fees:
 - TRANSIT - \$60 for Animal Entry Permit
 - ARRIVAL - \$65 total (\$60 for Animal Entry Permit + \$5 annual Pet License)

Vaccination Records: pets must be vaccinated with the following prior to entry:

- Dogs - Distemper/Parvo/Parainfluenza/Hepatitis, Leptospirosis, Bordetella, Rabies
- Cats: Rhinotracheitis/Calicivirus/Panleukopenia, Rabies

Flight Itinerary: provide a complete travel itinerary showing all flights, starting from your departure in country of origin, including any connecting or transit flights.

FAVN Test Results: results must directly be sent to our office from an approved CDC testing laboratory.

Quarantine Facility Reservation: you must make a reservation at one of the following quarantine facilities:

- Animal Medical Clinic: +1 (671) 637-8387
- Animal Pet Lodge (Military Only): +1 (671) 366-5020
- Harper Valley Kennels: +1 (671) 797-0393

Health Certificate: HC must be issued by a USDA-accredited veterinarian and submitted within 10 days of arrival date.

CDC Forms & Animal Care Facility Reservation: The CDC has federal regulations for bringing dogs into the U.S. Check our website or CDC website for full details on what is required.
